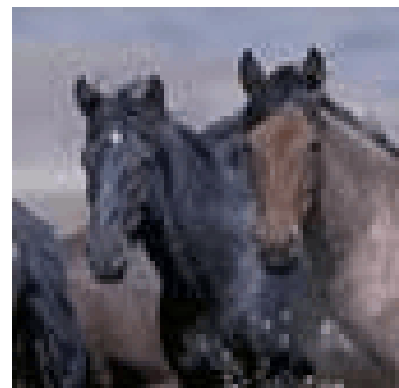
MONDAY, AUGUST 9 - There is more to the Reno/Tahoe area than gambling. Enjoy a hosted lunch overlooking Lake Tahoe in the Lakeview room at Cal Neva. This afternoon we will have a guided tour of the historic **Cal Neva** one the oldest gambling establishments in Nevada. Learn about the stories of Frank Sinatra and the Rat Pack, Marilyn Monroe, the Kennedy's and others. See the tunnel from the showroom to Frank's Cabin. Our accommodations for the next four nights will be at John Ascuaga's Nugget. You will receive a \$5.00 Cash and \$3.00 Food coupon with your stay.

TUESDAY, AUGUST 10 - Today we will travel to Lake Tahoe where our first stop will be for a ride on the **Heavenly Valley Gondola**. This afternoon we will visit the **Taylor Creek Stream Profile Chamber**. We will experience what it would be like to go below the surface of Taylor Creek. The floor to ceiling glass bay windows, waterfall, creek-bottom-like walking surface and sound effects allow us to experience the Taylor Creek environment without getting wet! Our last stop will be at the **Gatekeeper's Museum**. This museum is a reconstruction of the original Gatekeeper's Cabin - home of the water master who controlled the flow of water out of Lake Tahoe. It now showcases Tahoe history.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 11 - Today we are off to the Nevada State Museum historic town of **Virginia City** where we will board the tram for a guided tour of Virginia City. Afterwards there will be time to browse in the shops and have a hosted lunch at the Delta Saloon in the historic town of Virginia City. This afternoon we will make a stop at the **Chocolate Factory** for some shopping before arriving at the **Nevada State Museum**. This museum is in the former United States Branch Mint Building, where Carson City silver dollars were stamped 1870-93. Exhibits include historical relics, a ghost town replica, a gun collection, one of largest mammoths ever found in North America, a mint-mark coin collection, minerals and ores. In addition, An American Indian room displays willow baskets woven by the Dot-So-La-Lee of the Washoe tribe.

THURSDAY, AUGUST 12 - Today we travel north of Sparks to Palomino Valley. We will learn about and see some of the wild mustangs on our guided tour of the. **The National Wild Horse and Burro Center** at Palomino Valley is the BLM's largest horse preparation facility. The BLM gathers wild horses from July to February and first brings them to Palomino Valley Center. At the facility, the animals receive veterinary care, an individual freeze mark and inoculations. This afternoon we will visit the **National Automobile Museum**, home of the Harrah Collection. The Museum houses an astounding collection, where you can explore decades of intriguing automobiles, stroll down period-style street scenes and stand inches from cars once owned by the rich and famous. This evening we will have a hosted buffet dinner and then see the **Oak Ridge Boys** performance in the Celebrity Theater at our hotel.

FRIDAY, AUGUST 13 - Today we say goodbye to Nevada as we travel back to California. We will stop at **The Empire Mine**, in Grass Valley, where we will a hosted authentic miner's lunch served by ladies dressed in period costume and guided tour. This gold mine produced nearly 6 million ounces of gold during it's operation. William Bourn, Jr, inherited the Empire Mine from his father in 1877. With his own financial backing and the "mining genius" of his younger cousin, George Starr, The Empire Mine became a 'showplace in mining technology' at the turn of the century. The Bourn family and the Starrs enjoyed a rich and active social life as well, as evidenced by the lovely gardens, residences, and social clubhouse. Approximate arrival time back in the Bay Area will be 6 pm.
