SUNDAY, MARCH 12 - Come join us as we travel to **Southern California** to explore many interesting venues. Our first stop will be at Pea Soup Andersen's for a hosted breakfast. Our accommodations for the next five nights will be at the **Hilton Hotel** in Universal City.

MONDAY, MARCH 13 - After a hosted buffet breakfast this morning you are free to make your way over to **Universal Studios Hollywood** to explore this film studio and theme park. Go behind-the-scenes on the world-famous Studio Tour to explore sets where Hollywood movies are made. **Universal City Walk** is just outside the gates where you find lots of shops and restaurants. You will have the entire day to explore at your own pace. With your hotel right next door you can come and go as you like.

TUESDAY, MARCH 14 - After a hosted buffet breakfast we are off to the **Academy Museum of Motion Pictures**. This museum has six floors of exhibitions that will take you inside over a century of movie-making magic. We will stop at the **Farmers Market** to browse in the shops and have lunch on your own. This afternoon we visit the **Petersen Automotive Museum**. This museum is one of the world's largest automotive museums, the Petersen Automotive Museum is a nonprofit organization specializing in automobile history and related educational programs.

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 15 - We will have a hosted buffet breakfast before we depart for downtown Los Angeles. We will start with an audio self-guided tour of the **Disney Concert Hall**, the home of the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra. Lillian Disney made an initial gift in 1987 to build a world-class performance venue as a gift to the people of Los Angeles and a tribute to Walt Disney's devotion to the arts. We will also visit **The Broad Museum**, which is home to nearly 2,000 works of art in the Broad collection, which is one of the world's leading collections of postwar and contemporary art. Our third stop will be at the **Museum of Contemporary Art** where we will have a self-guided tour. All three of these museums are located near each other so you will be able to enjoy them at your leisure. One California Plaza is near the museums so that you can get a no host lunch at your leisure. This evening we will have a hosted dinner before we return to the Disney Concert Hall for a performance by the **LA Philharmonic**.



THURSDAY, MARCH 16 - This morning we will have a hosted buffet breakfast before departing for our guided tour of **Nethercutt Museum & Collection**. This museum was founded by J.B. Nethercutt in 1971 and its centerpiece is the prestigious automobile collection of the Nethercutt-Richards family, which has led several publications to name it as one of the greatest collections in the world. The Collection houses dozens of world-class antique music sets, including mechanical musical instruments, phonographs, massive orchestrions, dozens of player pianos and music boxes, and antique furniture. The Nethercutt Collection's Wurlitzer theatre pipe organ is the largest theatre organ in the Western U.S. and third largest in the world. This afternoon we will visit the **Ronald Reagan Presidential Library** where we will have a hosted lunch and a self-guided audio tour. There is a permanent exhibit covering Ronald Reagan's life, as well as memorabilia such as Air Force One, the aircraft personally used by the president, and a section of masonry from the Berlin Wall.

FRIDAY, MARCH 17 - Enjoy a hosted buffet breakfast before we travel to Bakersfield for a hosted lunch at **Hodel's**. Our accommodations for the night will be at the **Hampton Inn** in Fresno. Tonight we will have a hosted dinner at **Roger Rocka's Dinner Theater**. After dinner we will see the performance of "**Rumors**". A dinner party suffers a severe case of Farce when the host is discovered bleeding on the floor, and the guests start pointing fingers at everyone and anyone.

SATURDAY, MARCH 18 - Our Final Day! Hosted breakfast at our hotel. We will travel to the **Sizzler** for a hosted lunch. After lunch we will go to **Ghiradelli Chocolates** for a hosted ice cream treat and shopping. Approximate arrival time back in the Bay Area will be 5 pm.
